### Involved in the Work

A motivational speaker was addressing an organization in respect to their goals for the year. He mentioned it was the intention of those making plans for the year to get all members of the organization involved in a personal way. He pointed out that if all the members got involved in a this way then the organization would mean more to them and they would be much happier. This line of thinking and encouragement in the secular world needs to be applied in the spiritual world, specifically the church, as well.

Our involvement can lead to the salvation of souls and to peace and prosperity. When one is personally involved in the work of the Creator he is contributing to the most desperate need of man—the need of being saved from sin.

How does one get involved? There are so many avenues. Become involved in evangelism. Tell someone else about Jesus and His church. Become involved in the education program.
