Contentment

"Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content. I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me" (Phil 4:11-13).

Contentment is not discussed in any circles any more. Everyone is too busy wanting the next big thing to come down the pike. Not only is it rarely spoken of, it is even more rare for it to be put into practice. Do you know what contentment looks like? Is there someone in your life that exudes this Godly trait? It has been said that contentment is the flower virtue. beautiful to behold, but soon neglected.

Contentment is something that must be taught and learned. Just as Christianity is a taught religion, contentment is a learned trait, taught by those who have experienced it. No one is born being content. Everyone that learns how must continue learning their entire lives. If God expects His child to learn how to be

content, then it is possible, but a great challenge. But through Christ it is possible!

Paul had learned how to be content. He was found in all manner of situations. Most of them very uncomfortable (see 2 Corinthians 11). Yet, through those difficult and inhospitable times, he found a way to live. True living and contentment go hand-in-hand. Paul never taught passivity, stoicism, or resignation. He never sought sympathy. He did teach, by his own personal experience, how to live a contented life. In that life there is abundance. There is joy and hope!

Contentment is not attained by way of human reason and wisdom. One truly live on personal merit. The Christian must learn how to live the abundant life, filled with contentment from Jesus. He acknowledged that "foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man hath not where to lay His head" (Matthew 8:20). The very God of Heaven had no physical attachments, yet His life has been the most significant of all!

Contentment is a challenge to obtain in any circumstance. Sinful poor people do not become righteous when they come into wealth. (What amount of money would be the right amount for happiness?) Nor if they become powerful, educated, or popular. Contentment might actually be more challenging with worldly goods than without them. A respected, successful businessman might have the ability to support his family and be able to buy whatever he wants, but still be as miserable as the man living in a cardboard box! Contentment is not where you are or what you have, it is who you are based on your relationship with the Lord.
