Optimism

Ole Bornemann Bull (1810-1880) was a Norwegian virtuoso violinist and highly regarded by those in Europe and in the United States. One evening he was giving a concert and his A string broke. Instead of taking break to replace the string he simply played all the music without it - on three strings! That is the very essence of making the most of what life hands you, creating beautiful violin music on only three strings.

One thing that separated Ole Bull from others of his generation was his eternal optimism. No challenge was too large for him to conquer. No task too great for him to admit defeat. Optimism may be defined as the disposition to look on the bright side of life. It is to expect the best outcome in any given circumstance, regardless of what they might be. It is to work toward the best outcome and to believe that the desired outcome can ultimately be achieved. Optimism views setbacks as only temporary lessons that need to be learned and overcome for the best outcome, and that through those challenges the results will be greater than the initial goal. Optimism is the spirit of youth and adventure. It is the spirit of "I can." Paul, the optimist, said, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13). Faith in the unbeatable combination of self-help plus the Lord's help makes optimism sound reasoning instead of lunacy. Turning from the doubts of life, you can find an awakening, a confidence in life that is unknown in the world.

The right mental attitude is the key factor. It is worth more than gold to have the correct disposition that is able to look on the bright side of life. That attitude that the joy of life overshadows the pain found in it. Actions and happenings should be interpreted in the light of most favorable expectations, gives one an immeasurable asset. If one looks at our economy, it is true that Wall Street is influenced by outlook of the future. Enthusiastic optimism reaches such proportions that pessimistic reactions, with cooling effects, begin and continue until there is a change in attitude. It is human nature for people to reach great heights in accomplishments and then become deathly afraid of what might be around the corner. That fear generates pessimism, reason is nowhere to be found, panic develops, and successes become a distant memory. But with the right attitude, one can continue being successful because the drive to be the best is still there.

Faith in God is the best generator of optimism. Jesus said, "*Lo, I am with you alway, even to the end of the world*" (Matthew 28:20). Do we believe this promise of Jesus. Those that do have accomplished much. Those that doubt this promise of our Lord have done pitifully little, just like the one talent man. We go down life's path not by sight, but by faith (2 Corinthians 5:7). When we can do that to the fullest extent possible, we are promised that everything will work out in our favor (Romans 8:28).

As long as there is life there is hope. Today gives us an opportunity to begin again, or to continue to greatness. It allows for yesterday to be forgotten and something new to be made and accomplished. Today gives everyone another chance to succeed.

When we wake up ready to give it our all, there is cause to be optimistic. There is no optimism in mediocrity. There is no optimism in compromise or complacency. There is only optimism in giving the task at hand everything we have.

Setbacks are going to occur. Road blocks are going to be put before you. Others will doubt. YOU might even doubt. But never, never give up as long as life is yet in you.
