Abraham wanted peace with Lot, so he sought a way to obtain that peace. Jacob sent his sons in the middle of a famine to a foreign land instead of sitting in the desert waiting to starve to death. Bacchus wanted to see Jesus so he climbed into a sycamore tree so he could get a better view. Jesus surprised him by announcing He would be going to his house. In a parable, the merchantman diligently sought for a pearl and when he found it, he paid to obtain it.
