One cannot go over, under, around, or through the barricaded road; a change of direction is the only choice. But which direction is a choice. Choose wisely and after a number of other turns and twists, the bumpy road will likely lead back to the main road. Choose unwisely, and the traveller will be lost forever.

Truth is that prosperity and adversity counterbalance one another. For man's benefit, the wise Creator has balanced prosperity and adversity against each other. God has arranged the curriculum in the school of life so that man will lack nothing when school is out. But man must be studious! As life will have it, some will pass while others fail, but it is up to the individual which they will choose to be, a passer or failure.

Since everyone experiences difficulties and challenges in life, what is the difference between those that pass and those that fail? How one reacts. Many choose to give up and go backward. Instead of finding a better way they blame others, or perhaps remain a victim, and in so doing they hurt themselves and a host of others in the process. These people will never pass the tests of life. Ruin and heartache will always be their companion and they will desperately try to bring as many as they can along for the ride as possible. Then there are those that choose to use their detour to explore themselves and the world around them. They use their misfortune for their benefit and

He is one that can say that his burden has allowed him to see the stars. Much like Franklin Delano Roosevelt came down with polio, but that did not stop him from becoming the President of the United States, and lead this nation during the Great Depression and World War Two. There can be no doubt that these men and others have faced serious ridicule and other personal setbacks. These temporary uncontrollable things must be overcome. Reliance on God must be first and foremost in one's mind when dealing with the tragedies of life.

Instead of giving up on life, do these eight things to get back and stay on track to a successful life:

- 1. Self-inspection. When the apostles were told that one of them would betray the Lord, each asked, "Lord, is it I?"
- 2. Courage. Peter and the other apostles gave this answer to their persecutors, "We ought to obey God rather than men."
- 3. A disposition to pray. In meeting their opposition, Nehemiah commented, "Nevertheless we made our prayer unto God."
- 4. Work. The widowed Ruth gleaned in the fields daily to support her mother-inlaw and herself.
- 5. Have a forgiving spirit. Jesus prayed for His enemies on the cross, "Father forgive them for they know not what they do."
- 6. A spirit that returns good for evil. Saul admitted this greatness in David, "Thou hast rewarded me good, whereas I have rewarded thee evil."
- 7. Faith and perseverance. Job said, "Though He slay me, yet will I trust in Him."
- 8. Adjustment and determination. David lost his son but wanted to go to Heaven to see him again. -BTH
