Wisdom to Live By

There are many similarities between the conclusions in the book of Ecclesiastes and the truths observed in the book of Job. One such truth is that man is unable to understand all the works of God. Even the wisest man is unable to know all that God is doing and has done. It makes no sense for frail and ignorant man to rebel against the Almighty Creator! This that do so bring misery on themselves and their loved ones. Solomon felt that living in circumstances over which we have no control is one of the vanities of life. God has not revealed to us what life will bring or how death will come. We must be wise enough to understand that thousands die daily. Our very next breath could be our last one. Those that die in sin are not prepared for eternity. Solomon observed that the righteous are often hurt by the wicked that rule over them. He pondered the thought of why the righteous suffer and the wicked prosper. Some live with purpose and do much good for others. Others live shallow empty lives. We must have the vision to focus on eternal things that are genuine and real.

God's people must be wise and live lawfully. Wisdom is so valuable in life that it can change ones countenance and put a smile on ones face. A wise man and a sour face do not coincide. Wisdom will cause you to understand that you must obey the laws of the land. Loyalty to God also means loyalty to the laws under which you live, as long as those laws are not in direct conflict to God's laws. The wise will not seek to oppose the government or its laws. Obeying the laws of the land will keep the child of God out of trouble. If you do break the law, admit that fault, make restitution and return to being a law abiding

citizen.

Wise people prepare for death. Purchasing life insurance is an excellent idea, especially if one is a parent. But there is a more urgent purchase in preparation for death: becoming a faithful child of God. Life is hard and uncertain, but there is a time, place, and correct way to accomplish everything needed in life. When man does not do what he ought, when he ought to do it, problems, big problems, ensue. The people of God ought to be fearless in life. Be courageous in doing what is right even in the face of persecution or lack of immediate reward. The Christian should be filled with joy, regardless of the circumstances of life. Everyone faces challenges in life. The human experience is marked by loss and death. One's own death looms as an ominous dark cloud in the unknown future. Let not your heart be troubled! The one that is prepared for such moments is more capable to successfully navigate those storms of life than those that are caught unprepared. It is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment (Heb. 9:27).

The wise will understand the end of all things. Paul wrote, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose" (Rom. 8:28). Solomon pondered the reason that wicked men had the ability to rule over and persecute the righteous and vulnerable. Wicked rulers are arbitrary and tyrannical to the hurt of their own people. Many leaders of men, nations and empires rise in meteoric fashion with fear in their hands and cruelty in their eyes. They lead until their natural deaths and have "state funerals." To Solomon it seemed wicked rulers were vaunted while the righteous were forgotten. But those funeral rites were all in vain. The wickedness of one man is passed down to subsequent generations. The shortened life of a righteous man is greater to God than the lengthened days of the unrighteous. Those that live in abject rebellion to God and His word, do so to their own hurt.

God's people should seek after wisdom and find what is really important in life. Solomon concluded what man's purpose is while living, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man" (Ecc. 12:13). Obey God's plan of salvation and continually walking in the light. This is wise.
